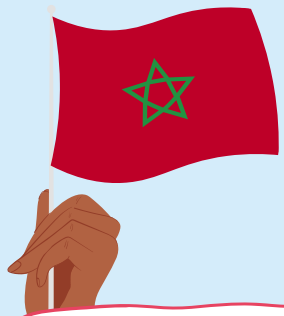
Palestine

- Youth Needs Assessment for YouthCan!, with young people leading the consultations
- Youth Employment Conference attended by decision-makers and businesses
- Piloting the global approach of virtual job shadowing during company visits



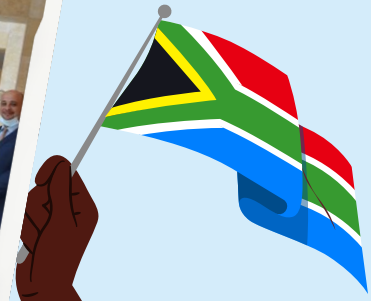
India

- Start peer to peer mentoring, with young people who left care as mentors. YAB members included in setting up the process and selecting young mentors
- Set up a feedback system for young people in YouthCan!, through which they can contribute during meetings



Morocco

- Youth Needs Assessment for YouthCan!, with young people leading the consultations in 1 location
- Presentation of young people's needs through bilateral meetings with partners



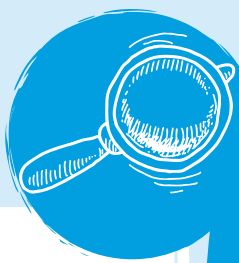
South Africa

- Youth Needs Assessment for YouthCan!, with focus on young people with academic challenges
- Presentation of these particular needs for fundraising purposes with local partners, who could fit those criteria



Peru

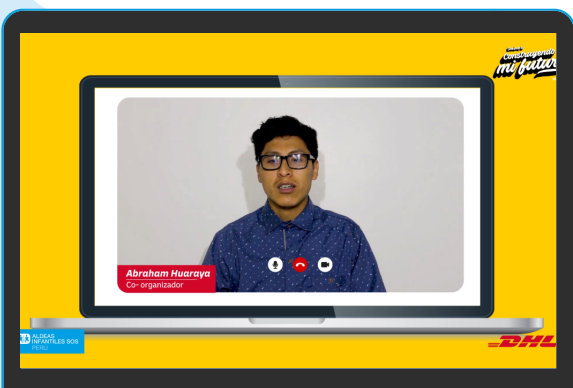
- Review the online mentoring process in Peru by assessing the needs of young people in 10 cities, in collaboration with YAB members
- Host the DHL webinar and share young people's needs with the partner



The 6th edition of the DHL Seminar 'Construyendo mi futuro' was co-organized this year by our 2 YAB members in Peru: Juan Manuel and Moises.

During 2 weeks, various DHL employees from several cities across Peru, met with 105 young people to discuss personal development and employability skills. Testimonials from participants show that what they valued the most were the strategies to grow professionally, shared by the DHL volunteers.

Juan and Moises enjoyed that they could support the organization of this event and most of all, bring the suggestions of other young people across Peru in, for further improving this format.

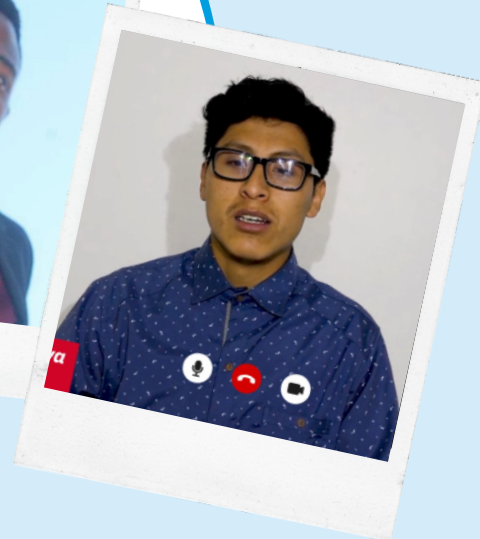
The things we learnt in the process and the fact that we see the decision-makers taking us seriously as the YAB, and giving us an ear.
